Action Item: **Reverse transfer (3+3) agreement with Cleveland University-Kansas City - WSC**

---

Wayne State College would like to extend this reverse transfer (3+3) agreement for the Doctor of Chiropractic (DCP) program, delivered by Cleveland University-Kansas City (CUKC). The agreement with CUKC facilitates admissions and advising processes, allowing WSC students to transfer credits from CUKC back to WSC in order to complete a bachelor’s degree in a Life Science or Health Science program at WSC. Under the provisions of this program, two pathways are available for WSC students to qualify for the 3+3 program.

The System Office recommends approval of the reverse transfer (3+3) agreement with Cleveland University-Kansas City at Wayne State College.

**Reverse Transfer (3+3) Agreement**

**Introduction**

The purpose of this Reverse Transfer (3+3) Agreement (Agreement) is to facilitate the admissions process for the Board of Trustees of the Nebraska State Colleges doing business as Wayne State College (WSC) students into the Doctor of Chiropractic Program (DCP) at Cleveland University-Kansas City (CUKC). This Agreement enables students to transfer credits from CUKC to complete a bachelor's degree in Life Sciences – Health Sciences from WSC.

**Agreement**

A student who pursues a bachelor's degree at WSC must:

- Earn a minimum of ninety (90) credits with a C grade or higher
- Meet the CUKC DCP admissions requirements
- Complete a minimum of 30 credits of general chiropractic coursework in the first four trimesters of the DCP.

**CUKC DCP Admissions Requirements**

The prerequisites for consideration of acceptance into the DCP are in compliance with the standards, policies and guidelines of the Council on Chiropractic Education.

1. Admission Path One to the Doctor of Chiropractic program (DCP) requires students to have completed a bachelor's degree with a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 3.0 or higher.
2. Admissions Path Two to the DCP requires students to have completed ninety (90) credit hours, including twelve (12) life science credit hours, earning a 3.0 GPA or higher. A pre-chiropractic, kinesiology, exercise science or other pre-professional health science major is preferred.
3. Admissions Path Three allows students who do not meet Path One or Two above to be considered for admission if they have earned ninety (90) credit hours, including twenty-four (24) life and physical science credit hours, with a GPA of 2.75-3.00. Students admitted under Path Three will be required to take the Flex schedule, which is a reduced course load for their first four trimesters.

Preferred sciences include biology, biomechanics, kinesiology, anatomy, physiology, and exercise physiology. A full year of chemistry (organic and inorganic) is also recommended. Preference will be given to candidates for the DCP who have completed the recommended coursework listed above.

Candidate's prerequisite courses must be from an accredited college or university and these courses are required to be transferable, college level courses. Remedial courses and courses numbered below 100-level are not acceptable prerequisite courses.

**Student Advisement**

An appropriate faculty or staff member at WSC shall be assigned and responsible to advise students regarding their academic preparation for admission to CUKC and for their ultimate goal of chiropractic licensure. This advisement shall include attention to special requirements for licensure in some states,
